

On November 30, Andrejsala will celebrate its Name Day

“The name day of Andrejsala is an annual tradition, which means that the area of the port and the embankment of the Daugava that used to be closed earlier are open to everyone. For a couple of years, the island has become a place, where various cultural events and art events take place, and bright creative ideas have been implemented”, the chair of the administration of Ltd. “Jaunrīgas attīstības uzņēmums” Valters Māziņš said.

During the celebration of the name day of Andrejsala, there will take place: the exhibition of the works by the students of the J. Rozentāls Riga Art Secondary School – Andrejsala Today and Tomorrow, the unveiling of the island’s symbol – the Anchor, the presentation of the project Museum of Contemporary Art, excursion around the island and the open day at the hostel Singalong, during which guests will have an opportunity to see and hear the works by sound, photo and video artists.

On the Andrew’s day, the first silk screening works exhibition by Patricija Brekte “Stundu leņķis” (The Angle of Hours), the exhibition of retrospective posters Dog’s Heart as well as the photo exhibition by Roman Korovin will be opened. The gallery Biezpiens will offer an opportunity for everyone to produce a memorable object for themselves: a shopping bag, a necklace, a Christmas decoration or other knick-knackery. At the same time, the team of artists and fashion designers will attempt to answer the question whether fashion is lost by the fashion installation «Moda: Kaput».

The Andrejsala name day celebration guests will be able to listen to the performance of the Belarusian ensemble Nadzeja (Hope) and the ensemble of the Russian folk music Harmonica, to attend the presentation of the DVD with the performance of the multimedia non-verbal theatre project Inside (Laboratory of Stage Arts), for which one year was required to produce, as well as the creative meeting of the project On the Road together with Signe Baumanė. The Andrew’s day video party is to finish the festival, and it will be a chance to hear pop music hits of the 80s and 90s.
